### STATEMENT OF ISSUES

David J. Walsh, Director, Division of Insurance (Division), Department of Commerce and Economic Development, State of Alaska, states:

- On or about February 4, 1994, an attorney-in-fact license application was received from Washington State Physicians Insurance Association, Inc. (WSPIA).
- AS 21.75.045(c)(7) requires that an applicant for licensure as an attorney-in-fact:

provide certified financial statements for the prior two years prepared by an independent certified public accountant that establish that <a href="mailto:the-applicant">the-applicant</a> is solvent, that <a href="mailto:the-applicant">the-applicant</a> is system of accounting, internal control, and procedure is operating effectively to provide reasonable assurance that money is promptly accounted for and paid to the person entitled to the money, and any other information that the director may require to review the current financial condition of the applicant[.] (emphasis added)

 Included with the application were the certified financial statements required under AS 21.75.045(c)(7). A review of these statements by Gloria G.

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Glover, CFE, one of the Division's financial examiners, reveals that WSPIA combined with its subsidiary, Association Insurance Services, Inc. (AIS), is not solvent since the stockholders' equity is below zero. The table showing the consolidation does show WSPIA itself solvent; however, the value of AIS on December 31, 1992 at \$20,000 on WSPIA's balance sheet is questionable due to its reported insolvency. The receivable of \$80,000 from AIS, an insolvent subsidiary, is also of questionable collectability.

- The application did not include a letter of internal control from an independent certified public accountant necessary under AS 21.75.045(c)(7).
- 5. Pursuant to AS 21.75.045(b), the application of Washington State Physicians Insurance Association for licensure as an attorney-in-fact is hereby denied unless and until the requirements under AS 21.75.045(c)(7) are met by WSPIA.
