RESOURCE POTENTIAL IS HIGH


- Potential Reserves: 1.0Tcf 3.5Tcf conventional gas in structural & stratigraphic plays*

SWARANOW?

 - Need to keep industrial consumers like Agrium operational






STORM CAT (ALASKA)

- CURRENT ACREAGE 24,150+ TOTAL ACRES


Combination of Alaska Mental Health Trust & State of Alaska Leases

REALIZING THE POTENTIAL

- CHALLENGES TO REALIZING THE RESOURCE POTENTIAL IN THE REGION:
