


Myths About Coal

- Healy Clean Coal Project is too expensive.




Pollutant Concentrations Which is the Coal Plant?







Coal and Natural Gas Emission Comparison








Coal Effect on Electricity Rates By State





HCCP could be saving consumers money today!

- 2001 Duke Engineering & Services Study
 - Limited retrofit reliable and safe.
 - Estimated year 6 cost \$0.0626/kWh
- Current estimated fuel only cost of displaced generation. (Aug 06 CPAC filing)
 - Diesel (HAGO), N. Pole \$0.2143/kWh
 - Naphtha, N. Pole \$0.1213/kWh
- Potential savings for 380,000 mWh
 - Approximately \$31 million



Which Fuel is Best?

- All fuels can and should be used in a manner that minimizes environmental impacts.
- All sources of "fuel" for electricity production have a place where they provide unique benefits.
- The choice should be based upon the mix of fuels that provides the best combination of:
 - Cost
 - Reliability and Security
