## BOUNDARIES OF THE FAIRBANKS NORTH STAR BOROUGH

I, MARK LEWS, Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Community and Regional Affairs, do hereby certify that the local government boundary change detailed below became effective on March 13, 1983.

On September 17, 1982, the Fairbanks North Star Borough submitted a petition for annexation pursuant to 19 AAC 10.450 to the Alaska Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

The Department of Community and Regional Affairs reviewed the petition and supporting documentation, and determined that all was in proper form and contained the necessary information.

Pursuant to 19 AAC 10.580.) the Local Boundary Commission (Commission) reviewed and approved the petition on November 29, 1982.

Pursuant to AS 29.68.010., the Commission submitted its recommendation for the expansion of the boundaries of the Fairbanks North Star Borough to the First Session of the Thirtheenth Legislature within the first 10 days of the legislative session. Effective March 13, 1983, the Legislature tacitly approved the recommendation pursuant to AS 29.68.010(a).

The post annexation boundaries of the Fairbanks North Star Borough are described as follows:

**Beginning** at **the NW** Corner **of** T4N, R5W, Fairbanks Meridian;

Thence easterly along the north line of T4N to the ridge between the headwaters of Trail and Poker Creeks;

Thence northeasterly following this ridge south of Ophir and Nome Creeks and around the headwaters of Hope and Charity Creeks;

Thence southeasterly following the ridge south of the headwaters of Bachelor and McKinley Creeks across the Steese Highway at Twelvenile Summit;

Thence following the divide around the headwaters of Harrington and Crooked Creeks;

Thence around the headwaters of Boulder Creek and the North Fork of the Chena River to the summit of Far Mountain:

Thence following the ridge north of the headwaters of the East Fork of the Chena River and around the headwaters of the Salcha River;

Thence southerly around the headwaters of Lost Creek to the ridge north of the Goodpaster River;

Thence southwesterly along this ridge, around the headwaters of Indian Creek, Gillis Creek, and Rosa Creek and continuing along the ridge between Buckeye Creek and Tenderfoot Creek across the Richardson Highway to a point in midstream of the Tanana River;

Thence downstream in midstream of the Tanana River to its intersection with the south line of T7S;

Thence west on this township line to a point midstream in the Wood River;

Thence downstream in midstream of the Wood River to a point midstream in the Tanana River;

Thence north and east in midstream of the Tanana River to its point of intersection with the west line of R5W;

Thence north on this range line to the NW Corner of T4N, R5W, the point of beginning, containing 7,361 square miles, more or less, all in the Fourth Judicial District, State of Alaska,
