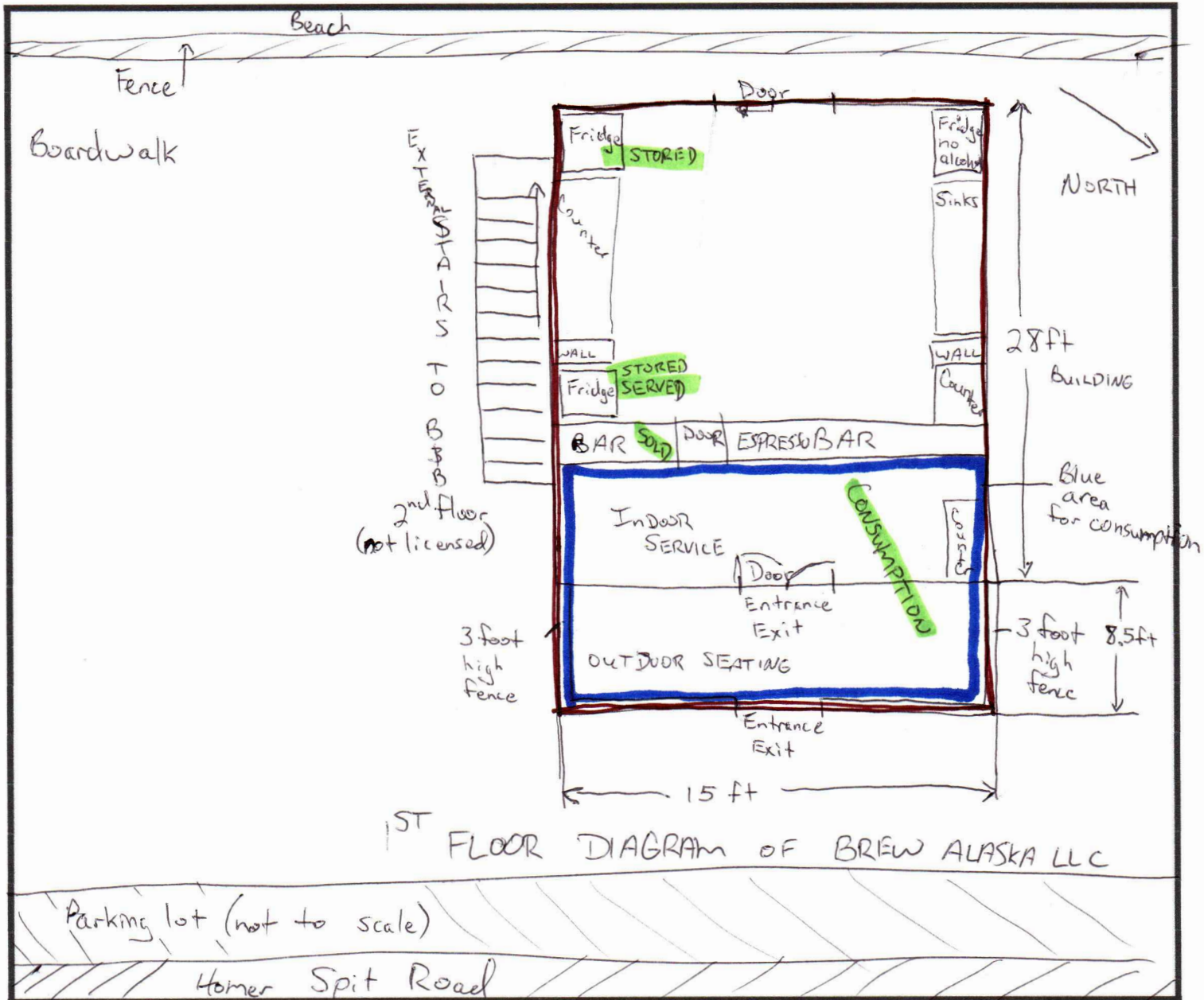

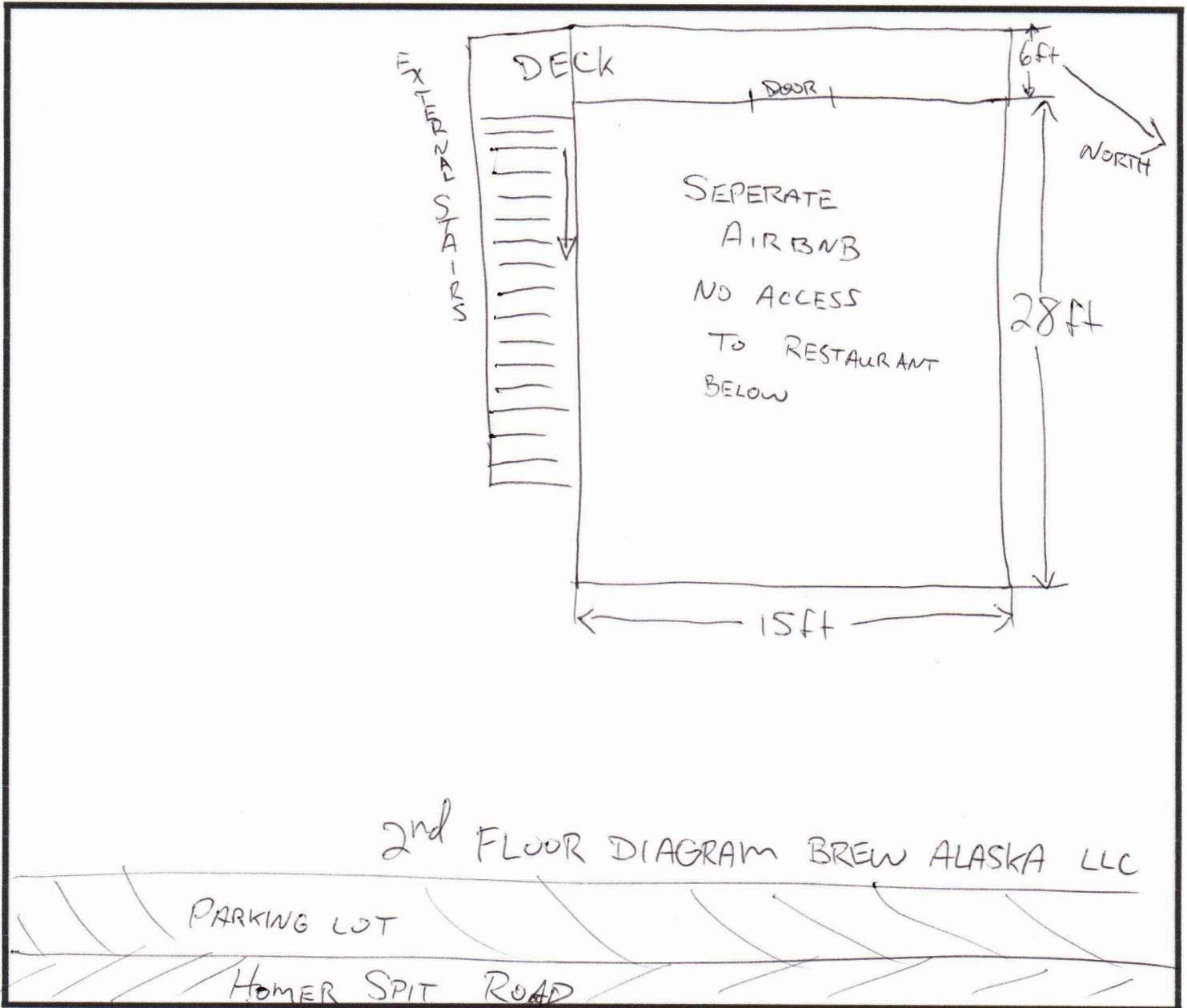

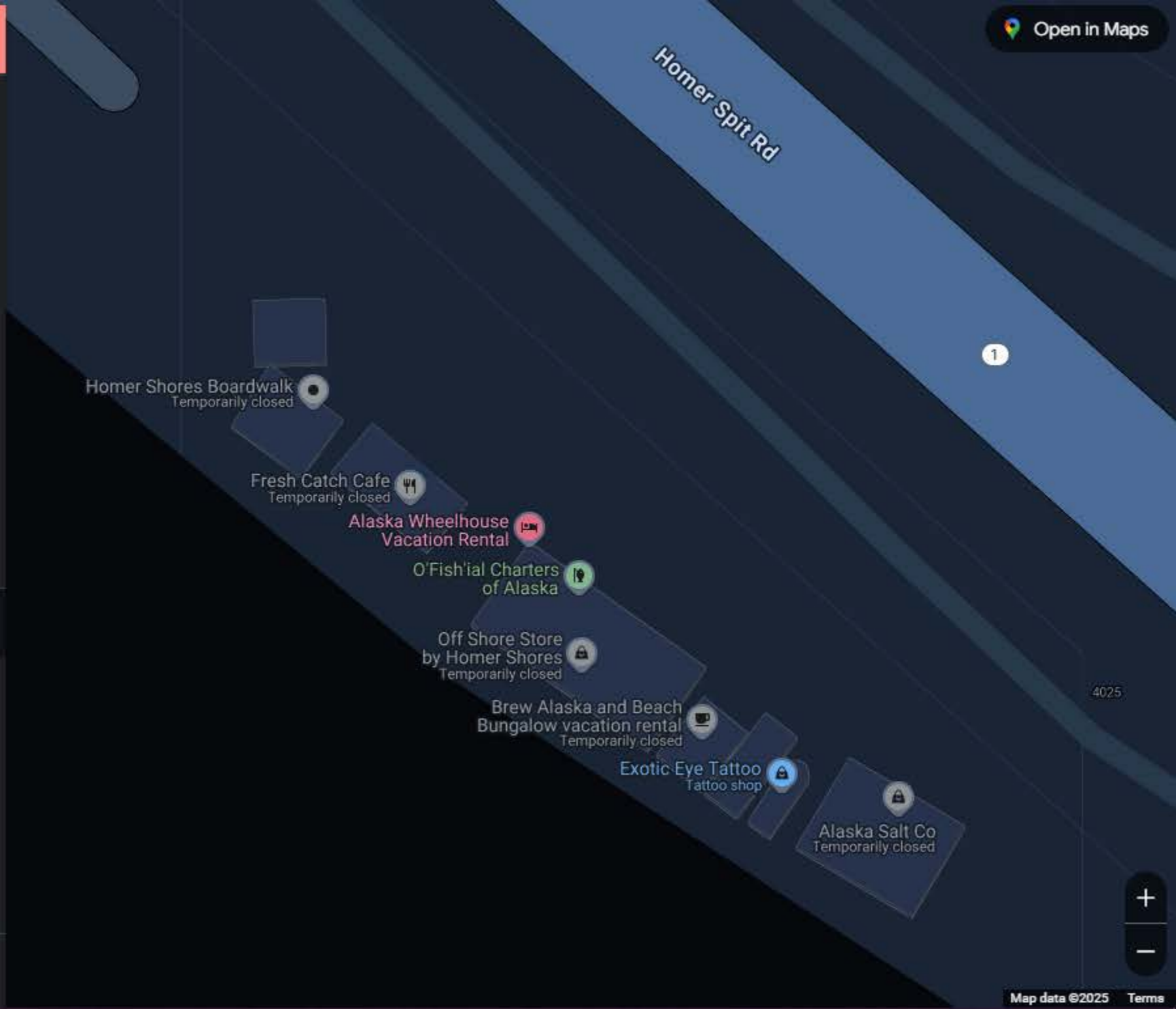

1. All new patrons are carded upon ordering alcohol.
2. All staff is trained in the identification of fake IDs.
3. Three foot tall wooden fence is around the outdoor servicing area.
4. Underaged persons will be monitored closely by our professionally trained alcohol servers.
5. Proper egress from the outdoor service area will always remain unobstructed.
6. ABC mandated posters as required by law are posted inside Brew Alaska and at the entrances of the outdoor seating area.
7. All entrances and exits will provide clear notice that NO ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED BEYOND THE OUTDOOR SEATING AREA.
8. Keeping outdoor seating area viable without any increased risk to minors exposed to alcohol WILL continue to be a part of our training for our staff.
9. All servers will closely monitor that only the guests that have been carded will have alcoholic beverages.
10. Our top priority continues in providing safety for all guests regarding the service of alcoholic beverages.
11. Servers will monitor the outdoor area when they are serving, via windows in the front of the building that look out onto the outdoor area, and by security camera.

Additional Measures to Prevent Underage Employees from Having Access to Alcohol

1. Alcohol will be kept locked when no server is present using the following methods:
 - a. Tap locks installed on kegerator, locked when not in use.
 - b. Kegerator door locked at all times.
2. Other types of alcohol (i.e. wine) will be stored locked.
3. Keys will only be issued to owners and servers, no common keys.

- Employment for any persons under 21 years of age: AS 04.16.049(c)

Southcentral Alaska visitors differed in a number of ways from the overall market.

- More than half of Southcentral visitors traveled to Alaska by air, a third by cruise, and a small amount (5 percent) by highway/ferry.
- Within Southcentral, especially high percentages of visitors traveled to Kenai/Soldotna, Girdwood, Palmer/Wasilla, and Homer. Visitors to these communities were also much more likely to travel between communities by rental vehicle and stay in private homes while in Alaska.
- Nearly all Southcentral visitors included a stop in Anchorage. Slightly less than half visited Denali National Park and Seward. A third visited Juneau and Ketchikan. Fewer visited Fairbanks (26 percent).
- Valdez visitors were unique in the large percentage that travelled to the state by highway/ferry (23 percent). They also stayed longer in Alaska, averaging 15.0 nights, and nearly all also visited the Interior.
- Visitors to Anchorage were most likely to report participating in culture/history activities in the community, whereas wildlife viewing was the most reported activity for those visiting Seward, Valdez,
