Ely C., Lt. Jamie, Dr. Clift, and Chair Bruce S. has no conflict or issues to report.

Jane S.— speaks about an ethics report that Bailey S. had submitted to chair Bruce S.

disclosing her consulting contract without listing the licensees she was consulting. Bailey S.

speaks on her ethics report that she has not been doing any consulting for Stuart Consulting
but doing marketing which includes branding and graphics development. Bailey S. states she
is currently not consulting anyone on anything that has to do with the Marijuana Control
Board or regulations. Director Joan W. asks if the branding has to do with Marijuana
products? Bailey S. responds that it does and was disclosed to Bruce S. and they had decided
to discuss it until later in the meeting. Bruce S. clarifies that he suggested to wait until the
agenda item comes up, so Bailey S. could state her concerns at that time. Bailey S. discloses
that she knows a particular licensee for 15 years and that she has done some of the
packaging for High Society Labs that is up for administrative hearing and making sure that it
is on the record. Kevin H. provides guidelines on the ethics act to avoid a violation under
39.52.960 and states he doesn't hear any interest held more of a relationship and not a

membership in an organization, but decision is ultimately up to the board. Bailey S. asks if she should speak on her consulting company under board governance each time. Kevin H. responds not unless the facts change. Sara C. from Commissioners office adds that if Bailey S. has financial contracts in the past and possibly in the future that she clarifies that will be, the facts that will change and if there are matters with the licensees in front of the board that will be the prompt to bring it up. Dr. Clift adds that a concern with potential relationship influencing the outcome and having any financial interest, is a concern. Ely C. says had a similar situation having a relationship with a licensee so he has no concern, a concern if there's other facts known that the board isn't aware of that may influence the outcome of the decision. Lt. Jamie echoes the board and believes easiest thing to do would be to recuse yourself as bias is involved. Kevin H. advises the Chair the only issue he can advise is on the ethics act to benefit her personal interest and to remain objective in her role as a decision maker. Bruce S. rules that she does not have a personal interest that has been identified and to keep her in the discussion and she can make the call on the issue if it is too close. Joan W. points out that when in deliberation of this license if information doesn't come out that she knows and influences her vote, it is important that the Board is informed.

Trevor Hayes, Representative of AMIA: Thanks Joan for commitment to industry and welcomes acting Director Kubitz. Businesses are struggling and urge board to help. Competition within the illicit market but also the legal market with bad actors with potential inversion. An immediate way to help is the reduction of license fees relatively quickly. Continue the discussion of moratorium of licenses since it has benefits. Don't see an issue with underage and shoulder taps but suggest a higher priority of inversion is an issue. A potential rewrite for regulations should be a priority. Requests support to continue to advocate to the reduction of taxes. Thank you to AMCO and the Board. A discussion on the businesses being impacted in the industry. Trevor H. a moratorium would offer protection with federal legalization moving that will change the dynamics. Dr. Clift asks does he not feel that a moratorium would increase the risk for small businesses? Trevor H. responds that it will add value to current licenses. Lt. Jamies asks if the bad actors in the businesses have been reported to enforcement. Trevor H. responds that it is a difficult thing and a risk. Lt. Jamie says not providing information may put the board and enforcement in a tough position. Ely C. mentions shoulder taps and fake id is less of a problem for Marijuana. Bailey S. adds to the comments of Trevor H. and Lt. Jamie, they want to pause the growth of the industry for enforcement to the inversion in industry. Bruce S. asks if we have the authority to stop issuing licenses. Kevin H. responds under 17.38.200 if an application must be

reviewed and the is section includes if a local government wants to issue a moratorium and can communicate with the board.

Sylvia C. from (inaudible) credit union- for enforcement to be cautious with rumors since they have seen may cases of taking competitors their down and they don't do anything wrong.
